This annual report represents more than numbers or program highlights—it reflects the dedication, relationships, and shared commitment that make our work possible.





POLICE PARTNERSHIPS SUPPORT COMMUNITY WELL-BEING



Police departments receive thousands of calls every year, with domestic violence and mental health-related situations making up much of the call volume. For over two decades, NEDFYS has partnered with police departments to provide community residents with immediate linkage to social services and mental health care to preserve limited police resources for crime response.

GUIDING YOUTH TOWARD BETTER OUTCOMES

NEDFYS provides services to youth and their families involved at each stage of the justice system. Our programs adhere to national and state best practices in community-based mental health care for justice-involved youth.



Our partnership with DuPage County Juvenile Probation hit the 15-Year mark in 2025. Our groups for youth involved with probation served over 80 youth and families this year. We celebrated this milestone at our Champions of Hope Community Breakfast in May.

INTERVENING EARLY CHANGES TRAJECTORIES


Our unique **ReDirect Group Diversion Program** is both a skills-based and community service program for youth at risk of entering the Juvenile Justice System.

Kyle's Turning Point

Kyle entered the ReDirect Program after a Battery charge and a history of school fights. At first, he was reluctant to engage – until a session about restorative justice sparked his curiosity about accountability.

Kyle made so many positive changes during his time in ReDirect, that once he completed his hours, he was selected by the Bloomingdale Police Department to serve as a Juror in their Peer Jury Program.

Today, Kyle helps guide peers through the same process that changed his life. He has since graduated high school and is now a full-time student at the College of DuPage. Life trajectory changed!

2025 ReDirect Service Learning Projects


Founded in November 2001, by Mark Martin, The Angel Card Project is an internet wide charity event designed to send greeting cards to those in need. The project started as a very small grassroots effort to reach a few individuals to let them know they were not forgotten. Supported solely by volunteers, the mission of "Sending Love, One Christmas card at a time" was formed. The ReDirect Program along with NEDFYS staff and interns sent 283 cards this holiday season.

BUILDING MENTALLY HEALTHY SCHOOLS AND COMMUNITIES

NEDFYS partners with local schools to provide school-based individual and/or group therapy for children and adolescents. Services occur during the school day, onsite at the school.



NEDFYS reached over 4,500 students through community wellness and social-emotional learning programs.



Collaboration with Tri-Town YMCA



In collaboration with the Tri-Town YMCA in Villa Park, we provided children at the Y with social-emotional learning and support to help them build resilience, manage emotions, and develop healthy relationships. Together, we created safe spaces where children can thrive both in and out of the classroom. This program is supported by the DuPage County Transformation Partnership Grant, a joint initiative of DuPage County and the DuPage Foundation.

Helped launch the Mindful Messages texting program through partnership with the DuPage Co. Behavioral Health Collaborative and the Youth Mental Health Subcommittee. The texts send tips and resources to parents and caregivers in the county who sign up.

IN THE LOOP

BULLYING, SAFETY, AND THE DIGITAL WORLD

In 2025, we introduced an interactive experience helping families navigate bullying and online safety. Parents and Students explored hands-on stations that unpack bullying and harassment, dive into digital safety across popular apps, and discover local resources. Collaboration with Henry Hyde Resource Center in Addison



Our prevention team continues to partner with the Henry Hyde Resource Center in Addison where we provide after school and summer programming. These programs facilitate life skills, social-emotional learning, and new experiences for the participants ranging from 1st through 8th grade.
